- Pig Boards bought 2 large boards, could not find small ones.

Bylaws

Meat Delivery

Jason and Janet graciously agreed to drive the trailers Lewistown Rental donated for use to deliver meat. Bruce moved and Jason 2nd to pay \$100 out of the sale fund to each Janet and Jason for expenses. Motion passed.

New Business:

Scale Repair

The portable large scale needed attention. Rockwell Scales was contacted, and there was a pin on the power cord that was replaced.

Judges

Both large and small animal judges will be new next year, Katie asked for input for both. The subject of pay was raised, as currently judges make \$100 per day plus mileage and hotel if necessary. The members felt that the rate should be raised to help secure quality judges year after year. Powell moved and Jason 2nd to raise large animal judges wages to \$250 per day, plus mileage and hotel. Motion passed.

Dean Rowland mowed and trimmed trees this year, and the members agreed to match the Stampede Club's donation to Dean to thank him and put towards gas costs.
